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INFORMATION REGARDING THE REAL ESTATE SELLER DISCLOSURE LAW

 - a. The buyer has received a one-year warranty covering the construction;
- 21 The building has been inspected for compliance with the applicable building code or, if none, a nationally recognized model building code; and 22
 - A certificate of occupancy or a certificate of code compliance has been issued for the dwelling.

Disclosures 24 regarding common areas or facilities are not required, as those elements are already addressed in the laws that govern the resale of condo-25 minium and cooperative interests. 2.6

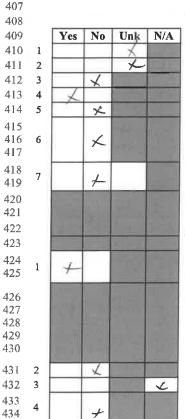

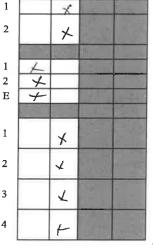
