I. LEGAL DESCRIPTION OF REAL ESTATE:

Situated, lying and being in the 1st Civil District of Clay County, Tennessee, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

6" buckeye and North 59 degrees, 43 minutes, 27 seconds West 81.18 feet to the point of beginning, containing 12.57 acres.
